From the Pastor

Welcome to the month of May, one of my favorite months. What is good this year, we celebrate the confirmation on Pentecost Sunday, May 23rd. We have seven confirmands: Kristina Conste, Cheyenne Costales, Harrison Cullen, McKenzie Dowd, Kwasi Enin, James Roberts, and Elliot Rodriguez. During the past year the confirmands have attended Sunday services and confirmation classes with the pastor, and spent 25 hours serving for the church. Finally, they will be confirmed on Pentecost and become the newest professing members at our church.

The confirmands and I have studied the meaning of the confirmation. What do we confirm? Baptism! At our baptism we were dedicated to God, being born again by the Holy Spirit. Therefore, our life is no longer ours but God's: We cannot live as we want but as God wants. Then, why do we confirm our baptism? In fact, our infant baptism was not our choice: You and I did not sign at our baptismal application form, nor even remember what happened at our baptism. If the infant baptism was the decision of our parents, then the confirmation is our own decision to accept and confirm our baptism. Now, the confirmands are old enough to make the important decision for their spiritual journey.

During the confirmation class in March, I emphasized that the confirmation is not the end of journey like a graduation ceremony but the beginning of new relationship with God. The confirmands are no longer contingent members but become professing members. I also shared my experiences that some confirmands had not continued to come to church after the ceremony of confirmation.

Then, one confirmand said, "That is a sin!" It was a very strong voice. I asked her why she thought that way. She answered, "You made a promise with God through the confirmation, and you did not keep the promise. In addition, you told a lie to the pastor. Therefore, that is a sin." After the class, I asked by myself: How many modern Christians are faithful to keeping the promise with God? And how seriously do I practice in my life what I confess to God? I learned sincerity and faithfulness from the 13 year old confirmand.

When you became a member of our church, you must have promised at the ceremony that you would "faithfully participate in its ministries by your prayers, your presence, your gifts, and your service" (United Methodist Hymnal, 38). Let us remind ourselves of our own confirmation. Let us remember when we became the members of our church. Our church has more than 300 official members, but not many of us have practiced what we promised with God at the membership ceremony.

We sometimes differentiate "active members" from "members." Yet, I heard a colleague of mine saying, "Our church does not use those terms because all members are active members." His church has applied to a strict rule of maintaining membership based on the Book of Discipline. So, if its members

want to keep their membership, they should do their responsibilities by faithfully participating in its ministries by their prayers, presence, gifts, and service.

I am saying this, not because I want to apply to the strict rule for our ministry together, but because I want to remind you and me what we have promised with God, and what we have to do as the members of our church. As I often say, rights and responsibilities always go together. As Christians we have become the children of God, and by faith we have been given eternal life. On the other hand, as Christians and as the members of our church we have some things we have to do. Now, let us learn from the 13 year old confirmand and practice in our Christian lives what we have promised with God. Happy Confirmation!
