From the Pastor

Time goes fast. We are in the month of Thanksgiving! As we approach Thanksgiving Day, we remind ourselves of how many reasons we have to be thankful to God. However, many of us soon forget and complain about everything. We worry about everything rather than give thanks to God. Now I would like you and me to have wisdom and faith, so that we may be the people who are able to give thanks to God all the time.

Let us listen to Jesus saying, "Do not worry about what you will eat. Look at the birds of the air; they do not gather into barns, and yet God feeds them. Do not worry about what you will wear. Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin, yet even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these."

The life of Jesus was similar to that of the birds and the flowers. Jesus did not have his own place in which to store food for the next day. He did not accumulate any property to secure his future. He lived one day at a time. He lived the day as it came without worrying about tomorrow. He lived like the birds and the flowers because he was completely depending on God.

Our trust in God makes us content with the present situation. The life of today is sufficient. Our life should be an expression of gratitude for what we have been, rather than the selfish expectation of what we want to have. Therefore, it is wise not to worry about things we cannot control but to trust in God who has control over everything.

Let us plan for the future. Let us do our best. Let us not worry about the result but trust in God. When we practice this faith, we will become the people of thanksgiving. We should take the day or the moment as it comes. Then, we can be content with what we are. We shall live this moment as fully as we can without regrets. If tomorrow comes, we will take it as God's gift and rejoice in it.

Do not worry about tomorrow. Let tomorrow take care of itself. Living this day without being anxious about tomorrow is the secret of a happy life. Let us live now fully and trust in God who gives us each morning the grace to live another day. Happy Thanksgiving!

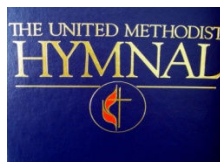
