From the Pastor

During the summer we had five children baptized, which means “five new members” at our Church. Why are we baptized? What happens at the baptism? What is the origin of the baptism? What are the biblical images of baptism? These are the questions we can deal with for an entire semester at a theological seminary.

Now I would like to focus on one of the five biblical images on baptism. That is dying with Christ and being resurrected with Christ. Paul says in Romans 6:3, “Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Jesus Christ were baptized into his death?” That is how Paul put it, and the answer is yes. We know this very well, but we often forget.

The Christian baptism implies the death and the resurrection with Jesus Christ. In the early Christian Church the candidates went into the water, which implies the death of Jesus Christ. And, they came up from the water, which implies the resurrection of Jesus Christ. It is good to be raised with Jesus Christ, but it is not pleasant to die with him.

When I was ordained, I shed tears for concern, because I knew I should die with Jesus in doing ministry. I knew it would be difficult, because it requires sacrifice, patience, and so on. It is difficult, but we Christians should do it, because there is no resurrection without death. Let us remember that Jesus called all of us as his disciples, and that we were baptized into his death. Therefore, we should die with Jesus Christ first before being resurrected with him.

Each of us has a different call from God, but in a sense, our calls are the same. Some are pastors and others are lay people, but we are all called in the disciples of Jesus Christ. We should sacrifice ourselves for our church and for our neighbors.

When I was ordained, I shed tears for joy as well, because I knew that although it is difficult to die with Jesus Christ, it is a joy to be resurrected with him. Six years have passed since I came to our church. We have encountered some difficulties in doing ministry together, but those difficulties have taught us how to be resurrected together with Jesus Christ. Now I rejoice because I know that you and I have become a family in Jesus Christ and will continue to serve each other as we do ministry together for God’s church. Amen
