We Protestants regard only the baptism and the Lord's Supper as the Sacraments while Catholics have the seven Sacraments. Last month, we thought of the meanings of the baptism through The Spire. Now, I would like to comment on the Lord's Supper, focusing on the thoughts of John and Charles Wesley, the chief founders of Methodism.

Most Methodists today know very well that John Wesley gave many sermons and Charles Wesley composed many hymns, but many of them do not realize how much the Wesleys emphasized the importance of the Lord's Supper. In other words, the Wesleys' insistence on Holy Communion has too often been ignored by succeeding generations of Wesleyans.

While living in a period of the liturgical transition, John and Charles Wesley showed their enthusiasm for the Lord's Supper and developed their own eucharistic theology. According to Jesus' instruction in the bible, they celebrated the Lord's Supper as often as they could and kept the balance between scriptural and sacramental elements in liturgy. Therefore, no element in liturgy was able to dominate over other elements. In addition, they founded the concept of the Lord's Supper as a means of grace by emphasizing the Spiritual presence of Christ's blood and body. (Catholics believe in the physical presence of Christ, the so-called transubstantiation.)

Like Wesley, modern Methodists in North America also have lived in a period of changes in the public worship. One of the liturgical reforms is that the Methodist Churches began realizing the importance of the Lord's Supper. Most Churches had infrequent communion, celebrating it quarterly. However, the Lord's Supper is now widely recognized as an ideal for liturgy by many Methodist Churches that celebrate the Lord's Supper more frequently than before, at least once a month.

Yet, modern Methodists still seem to miss something important in the Lord's Supper. I would like to remind you of Wesleys, who emphasized the work of the Holy Spirit and believed in the Spiritual presence that occurs in the Lord's Supper. Of course, it is important to celebrate the Lord's Supper on a frequent basis. However, what is more important, I think, is that the participants are able to encounter the living Christ through the Lord's Supper.

We should get rid of the idea of the Lord's Supper as just a symbolic ceremony and possess the belief in the Spiritual presence of Christ's body and blood. Then, we will be able to earnestly repent of our sins, receive the visible means of God's grace, and have the assurance of salvation through the Lord's Supper. And then, the table becomes the place where Christians keep religious solemnity, obtain visible grace, and taste heavenly joy.

When believing in the action of the Spirit in the Lord's Supper, we experience Christ's sacrificial self giving as, not only past history or future hope, but as present reality here and now in its very midst. Next time when you receive the elements, please remember this and experience the living Christ through his Spiritual body and blood. Amen.

CHILDCARE MINISTRY REPORT

Our Day Care and Preschool is growing steadily. Enrollment jumped from 14 students in October to 22 students in December! We produced positive revenue every month in the fourth quarter of 2013 with total revenues to the Church of just about \$3,000 for the quarter.

About 90% of our revenue comes from Day Care with the remaining 10% from Preschool. Preschool programs are easy to establish and there are many local preschools, but programs are limited to 2 1/2 hours maximum per day. Our Day Care license is much more difficult to obtain and maintain, but it allows us to keep children a full day. Many of our families are able to hold down jobs because of the high quality, reliable, affordable childcare we provide to the community. In December, our initial two year Day Care license was renewed for an additional four year period.

After months of heroic effort by Church volunteers, our growth is allowing us to hire more paid teachers, aides, and our new Childcare Director Ms. Amy Bowman, while still generating net positive revenue. Volunteers will continue to be an important part of our Childcare plan, but it's nice to give them a break.

We are actually approaching our licensed enrollment capacity on some days so work is underway to furnish and license two additional rooms, which will nearly double our capacity.

Thanks be to God for His grace and to all the many people whose prayers and service together have brought us through tough times to this level of success. Please keep the Childcare Ministry in your prayers as we begin our third year of service.
